

The IRC HOPE program provides comprehensive "wrap around" services to survivors of all forms of human trafficking



Case Management

Intakes, safety planning, interpretation, accessing benefits, referrals & transportation



Food & Clothing

Access to food and clothing through cash assistance and donation




Safe Housing

Temporary safe housing and long-term rental assistance to help survivors establish new lives



Education & Job Readiness

Access to ESL classes, job readiness training, and assistance finding work

LEGAL / BENEFITS ELIGIBILITY

Survivors who meet the TVAP definition of human trafficking are eligible for different forms of immigration relief, depending on their situation, age, and cooperation with law enforcement.

- Continued Presence
- T-Visas & Derivatives
- VAWA Visa

Survivors of human trafficking are eligible for state benefits within California. Upon certification by the Office for Refugee Resettlement, survivors may apply for Federal benefits.

- Refugee Cash Assistance
- MediCal
- Food Stamps
