Training Opportunities through the PACT Consultant Network

PACT (Preventing & Addressing Child Trafficking) is excited to offer in person and virtual training by our Consultant Trainers to empower California providers to improve a local response to child trafficking.

About Our Network: PACT Consultant Trainers are diverse professionals with industry and lived expertise of human trafficking. PACT staff provide additional support to our trainers and member counties at no-cost; such as: initial introductions, event coordination, co-facilitation, tech support, curriculum review.

Lived Expert Training Cost: Base training rate is \$250/hour per Consultant Trainer. Base Training costs include a minimum of one additional hour to presentation time to accommodate preparation, tech checks and debriefing with the host agency. ***Cost will vary on length of training, # of facilitators, travel etc. Base cost listed includes minimum number of presentation hours.***

Payment: Counties may contract with Child & Family Policy Institute as a vendor or pay trainers directly. Scholarships may be available for member counties with demonstrated need.

An Inside Look at Familial Trafficking Through a Survivors Lens



Description

Trafficking arising from within the family creates a unique set of circumstances, challenges, trauma and service needs for survivors. Learn from Diana as she shares insights into the world of familial trafficking. This training will address the implications of trafficking starting at younger ages, the importance of being not only trauma informed - but dissociation informed and offers practical steps you can take to assist survivors.



From Silos To Systems: California's Child Welfare Response to Child Trafficking

Description

Learn how California built a coordinated, survivor-informed response to child trafficking through the Preventing and Addressing Child Trafficking (PACT) model. This training shares lessons learned since 2014, tools developed, and practical strategies for fostering statewide collaboration. Participants will leave with a replicable roadmap to strengthen anti-trafficking efforts in their communities, regions, and states.

Learning Objectives:

- Understand the development of PACT's Model and network of collaboration to strengthen a Statewide response to child trafficking in California.
- Identify key barriers and lessons learned to inform replication of similar models in other jurisdictions
- Explore strategies to meaningfully integrate survivor leadership in program design, implementation, and evaluation.
- Access practical tools and resources to apply in local and statewide efforts.

Hiring & Supporting Lived Experience Experts

Description

Individuals with lived experience hold invaluable insights and capacity to enact meaningful system change. Yet, professionals who enter the anti-trafficking field often face systemic bias, lack of access to equitable pay, hiring or educational barriers. This results in limited power to enact transformative policy and practice to improve services to youth & caregivers. This training will explore key learnings and trauma informed engagement strategies for agencies wishing to partner with individuals with lived expertise to improve local programming.

Intersections with CSE & Child Labor Trafficking

Description

This training will help participants understand how child labor trafficking overlaps with commercial sexual exploitation, including how peer recruitment and forced criminality show up in child welfare and youth-serving systems. Participants will learn to recognize key signs, risk factors, and patterns of coercion among youth by identifying behavioral, environmental, and systemic indicators. The session will also guide participants in applying trauma-informed, coordinated responses that center safety, address basic needs, and connect youth and families to appropriate services and prevention resources.



Learning Objectives:

- Understand how child labor trafficking overlaps with commercial sexual exploitation.
- Recognize key signs, risk factors, and patterns of coercion in youth.
- Apply trauma-informed, coordinated responses to support affected children and families.

Length of Training: 1.5 - 2 Hours

Method: Virtual or in person

Audience: This training is intended for anyone in a youth serving role, either direct service or administrators.

The Intergenerational Impacts of Southeast Asian American Trauma & Sexual Exploitation



Description

War, violence and misogyny are among the deep rooted issues that Asian peoples have faced throughout history. This training will explore the systemic conditions of intergenerational exploitation, with a specific focus on the hyper sexualization of Southeast Asian and refugee communities in the U.S. Gain insight into the experiences of Asian communities and culturally responsive strategies to serve youth.

Trafficking Amongst Peers: Recruitment, Resistance, Resiliency

Description

This training examines the dynamics of labor trafficking by forced criminality, emphasizing how peer recruitment operates as a form of exploitation among youth. Participants will learn how coercion, manipulation, and survival tactics contribute to recruitment and how systemic bias affects both recruiters and those recruited. Through discussion, case examples, and lived expertise, the session provides practical approaches for responding with empathy and accountability while promoting harm reduction, safety, and opportunities for healing. Training provides an overview of how traffickers target youth to recruit their peers into commercial sexual exploitation as a form of forced criminality.

Learning Objectives

- Learn key definitions around how youth may be recruited into CSE by a peer or be forced or coerced to recruit a peer into CSE (a form of labor trafficking).
- Understand how peer recruitment happens and the venues in which to anticipate peer recruitment.
- Discuss techniques and practical strategies when addressing Resistance.
- Hear from lived experts on their personal journey of healing and Resilience.

Trauma Informed Language Training

Description

This training helps participants examine the impact of language when working with youth impacted by trauma, exploitation, or system involvement. Through discussion and practice activities, participants learn how to shift from judgmental or stigmatizing language to trauma-informed communication that centers respect, inclusion, and relationship-building. The session provides practical tools to model supportive language across settings, ensuring youth are seen as whole individuals rather than defined by their behaviors or experiences.



Learning Objectives:

- Understand how language influences youth engagement, self-perception, and service outcomes.
- Identify and replace system-based or stigmatizing terms with trauma-informed, people-first language.
- Apply trauma-informed communication in verbal, written, and team interactions to promote safety, dignity, and trust.
